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SECTION 4: First-Aid Measures

4.1. Description of first aid measures

In all cases of doubt, or when symptoms persist, seek medical attention. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person.

SECTION 6: Accidental Release Measures

6.1. Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures

6.2. Environmental precautions

7.1. Precautions for safe handling

Provide good ventilation of working area (local exhaust ventilation if necessary). Do not return residues to the storage containers. Handle with care - avoid bumps, friction and impact. Smoking, eating and drinking are forbidden in application area. For personal protection see section 8. Comply with the health and safety at work laws. Avoid inhalation of vapour and spray mist. It is recommended that operators should wear antistatic clothing and footwear. Solvent vapours are heavier than air and spread along floors. Vapour forms explosive mixtures with air.
